Mr. Jim Bean, 22 Middlesworth Farm Road, stated that cutting the “Facilities Manager” position is a foolish move. Somebody has to make sure that things are getting done when they are supposed to be getting done.

Ms. Kelly Werth, 17 Tall Timber Drive, stated concern that \$431,000 was cut from the K-8 budget and only \$127,000 was cut from the high school budget.

Mr. Craig Carpath, 15 Evita Terrace, stated that the lack of a “Supervisor of Instruction” position is the reason that Washington Township has fallen out of the top 10% of schools according to the State Report Card. He stated that we do have a lot of good teachers, but there are also many teachers that need to be monitored. He feels that it is hurting the students not to have a Supervisor of Instruction.

Mr. Kevin Ned, 65 Kim Lane, stated the Township could have subscription bussing instead of all students being bussed.

Ms. Michelle Skurchak, 8 Salisbury Lane, requested that the position of “Supervisor of Instruction” be reconsidered. She stated that a grant writer is very important.

Ms. Kristin Forrester, 17 Stony Brook Road, stated that cutting the “Supervisor of Instruction” position does directly affect the students. She stated that a “grant writing” position should be considered.

Mr. Richard Adalise, 49 Ascot Drive, stated that according to his calculations, the average homeowner will only save about \$36-\$40 per year. He feels that if the voters realized this, they would realize that the tax savings do not justify the cuts being made.

Ms. Mary Markowitz, Cindy Lane, stated that for a new school to open without library books is unacceptable. She does not feel that there should be any budget cuts.
