<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u> – The pledge of allegiance was recited.

<u>MAYOR'S UPDATE</u> – Mayor Short welcomed Jason, a student at Centinary College who will be working in the municipal offices for two weeks as part of a requirement for graduation in his major.

Mayor Short announced that on February 23, 2012, 7:00 P.M. at West Morris High School (Mendham), a meeting will take place to discuss a possible change in the funding formula for Washington Township, the Mendhams, and the Chesters and related issues.

Mayor Short noted that the budget meeting originally scheduled for February 21, 2012 has been moved to February 27, 2012 so that we will have State Aid numbers before further budget discussions are held.

Mayor Short stated that a shared services meeting was held on February 16, 2012 with the Board of Education to discuss the construction of a bus facility on Rock Road. The Township would initially fund its construction and would be reimbursed by the K-8 School District. This project is moving forward.

Mayor Short stated that residents with individual wells should register with JCP&L so that in the event of a power outage, JCP&L will know to give those residents priority in the restoration of power. Links to register are on the Township website, the Observer Tribune website, Long Valley Patch website and JCP&L will send a notice with their March invoices. These registration forms will also be available in the Municipal building. Mayor Short further stated that Washington Township is working with JCP&L to get the entire Township under one area code so that we can be more easily identified as a community when outages occur.

<u>EAGLE SCOUT RECOGNITION</u> - - Scout Spencer Hanus, Troup 158 was recognized by the Township Committee for achieving the rank of Eagle Scout. Scout Hanus was commended for his efforts.

PROCLAMATION – Mayor Short, on behalf of the Washington Township Committee, read into the record a proclamation declaring Wednesday, March 2, 2012 as "**Read Across America**" day.

<u>BARTLEY/NAUGHRIGHT LIGHT CHANGE</u> – <u>Comm. Tobin</u> asked about the status of a modification of the Bartley/Naughright light. Mayor Short asked Comm. Tobin to contact Lt. Compton as this was previously approved.

<u>LONG VALLEY PLAZA STOP SIGNS</u> – <u>Comm. Tobin</u> stated that two out of four stop signs in that shopping plaza have been knocked out of service. Comm. Tobin stated that the landlord of the shopping plaza has not moved to correct the situation. <u>Attorney Jansen</u> stated that the landlord has a significant liability if those signs are not re-erected. Chief Bailey will notify the landlord to initiate the process.

BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING - Comm. LiaBraaten asked about the specific time for the West Morris/Mendham High School meeting mentioned earlier. Mayor Short stated that the meeting is scheduled for February 23, 2012, 7:00 P.M. Mayor Short described the schedule and the presentation. He stated that it is an informational meeting, not a political meeting. Mayor Short further stated that the discussion will focus on the quality of education, how it is being funded, and the burden of the tax bill, etc. New Jersey is one of the top three states for education and Washington Township is in the top 10%. The decrease in enrollment will also be discussed. As two of the Superintendents have resigned, Mayor Short suggested that this is an opportunity for consolidation.

SPORTS GROUPS – TROPHY CASE – **Comm. Kennedy** is obtaining information on the size of the display case needed at the Public Library. **Mayor Short** inquired about an artifact display case in addition to a trophy case for the Library.

<u>APPLICANT TO INTERVIEW</u> – <u>Administrator Burd</u> stated that there is one more applicant to interview. Comm. Roehrich and Comm. Tobin will conduct the interview at 6:45 P.M. before the next budget meeting on February 27, 2012.
