DISCUSSION

ENERGY AGGREGATION – The Committee agreed to obtain more information regarding this program in order to consider participating.

<u>REGENCY AT LONG VALLEY – DEVELOPER'S AGREEMENT</u> – <u>Attorney Jansen</u> informed the Committee that a decision has not been rendered by the court and he advised that Attorney Buzar recommends that the Committee wait for that decision before taking action. The current agreement does not expire until December.

BOARDS & COMMITTEES – Interviews will be scheduled for Monday evening.

<u>FIRE DEPARTMENT STUDY</u> – The Committee discussed the five proposals that were received by the Township. Comm. Tobin recommended that Kramer be retained to conduct the Fire Department Study.

<u>PLENARY RETAIL CONSUMPTION LICENSE</u> – No bids were received. The committee will consider offering a new license for sale next spring or summer.

BEST PRACTICES – Administrator Burd will certify that the Committee has read and understands the Best Practices worksheets. They were emailed to the state prior to the 9/28/12 deadline. The Committee requested Attorney Jansen prepare a draft Pay-to-Play Ordinance.

WATER STORAGE TANK – STONEY BROOK ROAD – The current tank that has failed is a 10,000 gallon tank and is not recognized by ISO. The ISO now requires a 30,000 gallon tank as the standard. Repairs can not be guaranteed, although the cost is much less than replacement of the tank. The tank issues will be further discussed at Monday night's meeting. <u>Comm. Tobin</u> stated that he would contact the Chiefs of the Fire Companies for their input before Monday's meeting.

<u>NOVEMBER WORK SESSION</u> – Both Mayor Short and Comm. Roehrich will be out of town for the November Work Session. Administrator Burd will review the agenda and if it is light, the November Work Session will be cancelled.

<u>SCHOOL BOARDS AND MAYORS</u> - <u>Mayor Short</u> stated that on October 30, 2012, at 7:30 PM, a meeting will be held at the municipal building with the school boards and mayors of the various districts. Several different options are being discussed.

200 YEAR ANNIVERSARY – The Committee is looking forward to Saturday, September 21, 2013 as the Township's celebration date and will request that no sports programs within the Township be scheduled for that day.

ELECTRONIC RECYCLING EVENT – **Comm. Tobin** stated that this Saturday is set aside for electronic recycling.

<u>MEDICARE</u> – <u>Comm. Tobin</u> stated that Medicare signups for the coming year are between October 15 through December 1. He suggested assistance be provided for those individuals who will be signing up for the first time.

DRUG DISPOSAL - Chief Bailey stated that the program was successful.

<u>NEW POLICE CARS</u> – <u>Chief Bailey</u> may have found a discounted price for the purchase of lighting equipment for the new vehicles. The Committee agreed that an avenue for discounted prices should be considered. The Committee would like to investigate this discount and review the financial situation to see if these purchases can be made.
