The Regular Meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Washington was called to order by Mayor Short at 7:38 P.M.

Adequate notice of this meeting was sent to the Observer Tribune and the Daily Record on January 9, 2014 and was posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building on the same date. This meeting is being held at the Washington Township Municipal Building, 43 Schooley's Mountain Road, Long Valley, New Jersey. Notices of this meeting were sent, as there were requests.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u> - The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

MAYORS UPDATE.

<u>Mayor Short</u> provided an update on road work in the Township. Work on Schooley's Mountain Road began today, and the total project should take three weeks. The Route 46 Bridge will be closed August 16 for ten days. Newburgh Road Bridge work continues. The entire length of Bartley Road will be repaved with the work scheduled for October. The County is aware that this is a major route to West Morris Central High School and we are trying to have the County amend the work schedule. With regard to West Mill Road we are still waiting to hear if the grant application will be approved.

<u>Mayor Short</u> and <u>Administrator Coppola</u> met with officials regarding Cooper Chemical on Parker Road. The owners would like to redevelop the 15 acres. The current zone is Office/Research/Industrial. This would be a Brownfield Redevelopment project. They still owe \$2,000,000 for municipal taxes.

The Green Festival and Family Fun Day will be held on August 16 at Rock Sprig Park, noon to 4:00 PM.

The Washington Township Police Department will celebrate its 50th Anniversary on September 13 at. 3:00PM. It will include refreshments for the public.

DPW Bucket Truck: A \$150,000 Budget request that was deferred to see if a used truck could be purchased was worth the wait. At a recent Gov Deals Auction the Township acquired a truck for \$6.00. After a mechanical inspection a few thousand dollars will be invested, but this is truly a wonderful savings for the municipality. <u>Comm. Tobin</u> also indicated that this truck is not only beneficial for the care of trees but will be helpful for making repairs to multi-level municipal owned buildings.

PROCLAMATION. Mayor Short, on behalf of the Washington Township Committee, read into the record a proclamation promoting the Morristown Festival of Books and the 'One Community, One Book' program.

EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT PRESENTATION. Scout Jack Layfield, Troop 436, presented his proposal for a kiosk near the basketball and tennis courts in Rock Spring Park. The total cost would be \$996.85, which he will fund with material donations from stores and monetary donations from family and friends. If his budget allows, he would like to incorporate a bench into his design. The Committee commended Jack on his professional presentation and thanked him for considering this worthy and much needed project.

<u>PUBLIC PORTION.</u> <u>Mayor Short</u> opened the meeting to the public.

<u>Fred Smith</u>, 167 Kings Highway questioned the proposed Village Center. <u>**Mayor Short**</u> explained that this is simply a concept. There is no official application before any Board. <u>**Mr. Smith**</u> stated that he does not believe the town needs more housing.

<u>Maureen Storey</u>, 8 East Mill Road said she was informed by a local business person that construction on the Village Center will commence in eighteen to twenty four months. <u>Mayor Short</u> answered no that this is still only a concept. If it were to proceed there is much work to be done, including the adoption of an Ordinance, State approval, and Planning Board review and approval. <u>Ms Storey</u> questioned whether the municipal parcel would be sold. Mayor Short answered that it would be either sold or exchanged for a value equated to the cost of constructing a community center. <u>Ms. Storey</u> was also concerned about the noise of the fire siren at the proposed firehouse on Fairmount Road and the impact it will have on the sheep at The Valley Shepherd.

<u>Sue Jones</u>, 127 Kings Highway requested an update on the project, specifically the traffic study. <u>Mayor Short</u> deferred the response to Comm. Tobin. <u>Comm. Tobin</u> reported that perhaps the final meeting of the subcommittee is being scheduled, which could be followed by the steps that Township must follow if redevelopment is pursued. <u>Mayor Short</u> advised that the traffic studies are available in the Planning Office.

Also, there needs to be more cooperation from Police to report animals they suspect are not licensed.

Administrator Coppola answered that the Township has sent letters to those pet owner who have not renewed pet licenses in recent years. Summonses have been issued for those who have not responded and Animal Control notified the Township of any responses involving unlicensed animals. Everything is being done, short of an animal canvass. Mayor Short requested that Comm. Tobin obtain recommendations from the Board of Health so the Township Committee can discuss this matter at next month's meeting. Comm. Tobin suggested that Mr. Coppola contact the Board of Health rather than himself.

<u>Comm. LiaBraaten</u> reported that a new Incident Command Vehicle will soon be delivered to the Schooley's Mountain Fire Company. Previous discussions regarding having two incident command vehicles were not resolved. <u>Comm.</u> <u>LiaBraaten</u> expressed the Fire Department's need for two incident command vehicles. After some discussion it was agreed that the soon to be former incident command vehicle, [Durango] will continue to be insured for the remainder of the year, however, fuel and maintenance will be at the expense of the Fire Company's Corporate Budget. <u>Comm.</u> <u>Babb</u> abstained from the development of this consensus. In October, <u>Comm. LiaBraaten</u> and <u>Comm. Babb</u> will have ready for Township Committee consideration a Municipal Vehicle Policy.
