The Regular Meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Washington was called to order by Mayor Roehrich

Adequate notice of this meeting was sent to the Daily Record and the Observer Tribune on January 7, 2016 and was posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building on the same date. This meeting is being held at the Washington Township Municipal Building, 43 Schooley's Mountain Road, Long Valley, New Jersey. Notices of this meeting were sent, as there were requests.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u> – The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

<u>PROCLAMATION – Breast Cancer Awareness Month</u>. <u>Mayor Roehrich</u>, on behalf of the Washington Township Committee, read into the record a Proclamation declaring October Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

<u>PRESENTATION - Sarah Guida - Gold Award Project. Scout Guida</u> will bring the national program Wreaths Across America to Washington Township. She will be hosting a Memorial Service on December 17, 2016 at the Senior Center followed by the laying of 230 wreaths in 5 cemeteries on graves of veterans.

MAYOR'S UPDATE. The Washington Township Environmental Commission is asking for volunteers to join its invasive plant task force. The task force will help restore Washington Township's natural environment by identifying and removing the non-native invasive plants that are taking over our land. Interested residents can sign up for the task force on the Township website and educate themselves on this growing problem threatening the quality of our environment and the quality of life for both humans and wildlife.

The Township Committee will host a special meeting this Wednesday at 7 p.m., half an hour earlier than our regular meetings, so everyone can get home for the debate. This will be the second special meeting to discuss the Regional Board of Education Funding question on the November ballot. School board members will be present but will not be making a presentation.

Information on the referendum is available on the school board's website. This information can also be found on the Township website along with the board's presentation.

Trick or Treating in Washington Township will occur between the hours of 2:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on October 31, 2016. The prohibition on overnight parking will begin on Nov. 1. Per ordinance, no person shall park a vehicle on any street or road in the Township between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m., from November 1 through April 15. This shall include all roadways.

<u>PUBLIC PORTION</u>. <u>Mayor Roehrich</u> opened the meeting to the public.

 $\underline{\textbf{Bill Leavens}} \text{ and } \underline{\textbf{CJ Sinko}} \text{ from the Washington Township Environmental Commission discussed invasive plant species}$ public education and eradication efforts within conservation easements. The Township will deal with invasive species within conservation easements on a case by case basis, as homeowners come forward about removing them from conservation easements on their property. **CJ Sinko** shared information he received from Warren County Soil Conservation about solid waste management relative to animal waste on farms. Mr. Sinko would like to invite Warren County Soil Conservation to make a presentation to the Committee and invite local farmers. The Committee agreed to have the group come to a Work Session meeting, possibly in November.

There being no further questions or comments, <u>Mayor Roehrich</u> closed the meeting to the public.

**<u>Best Practices Checklist</u>** - The Committee reviewed the best practices checklist.

<u>Line Painting- Administrator Coppola</u> reported that a 5 gallon can of paint would cost approximately \$55, and that the County Engineer is approving blue line painting on County roads, if the Township is interested in that option. Chief Almer would like to see the blue line on Schooley's Mountain Road as well as E. Springtown Road. Administrator <u>Coppola</u> will follow up with <u>DPW Superintendent Frech</u> on how much paint would be needed.

Motion to approve the painting of a thin blue line on East Springtown and Schooley's Mountain Road in support of the Washington Township Police Department was made by Vice Mayor Short, seconded by Comm. LiaBraaten. Action is contingent upon County approval of painting the line on Schooley's Mountain Road. Motion was carried by the following roll call vote:

#### RO-11-16

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WASHINGTON, COUNTY OF MORRIS, AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO AMEND CHAPTER 137, PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WASHINGTON

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Washington, in the County of Morris, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 137, Parks and Recreation Areas, Section 137-1, Prohibited acts, is hereby amended and supplemented by the addition of paragraph V to read as follows:

"V. Be present in a park after dusk or before dawn, either on foot or by vehicle, unless in connection with an event authorized or sponsored by the Township."

SECTION 2. All ordinances of the Township of Washington, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
