

"BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, that the following road, (All that part or portion of a road located in the Township of Washington, County of Morris and State of New Jersey, beginning at the County road in Long Valley and running thence in a southwesterly direction through Middle Valley a distance of four miles, more or less, to the Hunterdon County line near the late residence of L. H. Trimmer, deceased",) be taken over by this Board and made a County Road in pursuance of Chapter 185, Laws 1918, Section 1116.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution accompanied by a resolution of the Township Committee of the Township of Washington consenting to the taking over of said road shall be filed in the office of the Clerk of the County by the Clerk of this Board."
